2¢ Carmine Fraudulently perforated 12 at top and bottom.



3¢ Violet Trimmed horizontal perforations to resemble coil stamp. P F C # 166,669



2¢ Carmine Rotary Coil Fraudulent Cancellation made by laser printer or photocopy machine. See 5¢ Blue 1902 issue.



2¢ Carmine Fraudulently perforated 11 on all sides.



3¢ Violet Fraudulently perforated 10 on all sides.

2¢ Carmine, Postal Forgery Imitation of 2¢ Surface print. Printed in sheets of 10, perforated on all sides. Sold in NYC.


