


3¢ 1857 - Type II - Imperforate between  
Oct. 3, 1939 - Norman Serphos of the Scott Co.  
submitted to me a photograph of a piece of  
cover with a V. pair and single 3¢ 57 - Type II  
continuous lines. These were on the piece  
arranged as a vertical strip of three, severed  
from the stamp which was below by scissors.  
Cancel dim but appears to read "Griffin Ga" -  
Serphos wrote they had soaked the items from  
the piece and price to me was \$1075.00 net.

1857- 3¢ Part Perf Type II 

Lot #1 - 1857 3c, Type II, pair horizontal imperf. Well centered with nearly full original gum. Dr. Chase states that heretofore the only representation of this rarity better than a few single used copies of more or less dubious character, has been a used strip of three. It is therefore unique unused. This pair was recently found with other correspondence on an unmailed large envelope (addressed to R.G. Dunn & Co., Pittsburg). We removed it, preserving the gum practically intact. The pair was cut at right leaving a wide margin, but severed at left by tearing; line of adjoining stamp (over)

shows at bottom, but a small part of outer line opposite upper left rosette is gone. The right stamp is the variety "dash below button." Color and centering are perfect. A very rare and choice piece

Lot 20 - 3c rose imperf horizontally, not catalogued, should be 44c, vertical pair from top of sheet, the upper stamp cracked by a crease, the lower slightly cut into at bottom. This pair was withdrawn when offered in our 131st Sale, as several experts insisted it was a fake, but they now agree that it is absolutely genuine. A great rarity.

Dr. Carroll Chase has just shown us a copy of the 1857 3c II on piece wherein the stamp shows a distinct double print. This is not a kissed print but a distinct double print, the stamp having gone through the press twice. Every line is doubled. It is cancelled with a circular "White Sulphur Springs, Va." postmark. The date is "14" but the month cannot be deciphered. The variety is supposedly unique. The 3c 1851 double print was also found by Dr. Chase and when we sold a portion of this wonderful collection some years ago this unique item went into the Jefferys collection where it still remains.

1851 - 34 Experimental Perf—

Lot 158 - 3c dull red (33), horizontal strip of 4, perforated at the left, and with experimental roulette top and bottom. The right hand stamp is damaged, and the strip is obliterated by pen marks. These stamps were made and submitted to the government as an improvement on imperf stamps. The roulette was not adopted but the perforation came into use in 1857. Very interesting and rare; from Stanton Collection.

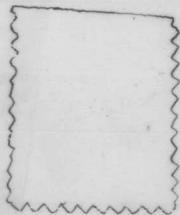
