Things with me stampically are about the same. I don't do a great deal of buying, but I did get a cover that was sent to Jessup -- and that J did not want -- a block of 19 and a single of Type II 3c '57 on back of a cover to Italy. It plated as 57 to 100 L15, and two of the stamps have recut upper left triangles. The block extended over the edges of the envelope so the two outer rows of stamps were so badly mangled that I trimmed off the rough edges so now call it a v.f. block of ten with giant parts of nine other stamps attached (actually the attached stamps are from  $3/4$  to  $7/8$  complete). This is believed to be the largest known used block of the 3c Type II. The largest that I can trace anywhere is a block of ten without the extra stamps attached.
