



One of our mutual friends advised him it was not a strip of six but two strips of three and as a consequence he did not get it. Now Harry keep this strictly confidential because there is no use causing any ill feeling. I examined that strip and I still believe it is a strip of six - I am appealing to you - Is it a strip of six or two strips of three. If my friend was influenced to the latter opinion then he thinks I was all wet. Was I? I have known that cover way back to the nineteen twenties and it has always been listed as a strip of six. Please let me know by return mail.
